

Pupil Leadership Team

Our Year 6 Pupil Leadership Team provides an opportunity for children to take an active role in shaping our school community. Led by our Junior Leadership Team (JLT), pupils are encouraged to develop leadership skills, responsibility and a sense of pride in their school. This ties in with our British Values of Individual liberty of making our own choices of which role and responsibilities to apply for, Mutual Respect through working together to maintain a good culture and democracy through the voting systems and having a voice to make decisions across the school alongside School Council, Eco Council and JTAs.

Head Pupils / Deputy Head Pupils

- Responsibilities: Lead the student body, represent the school in meetings and events, present updates in assembly or to senior staff.
- Skills Developed: Public speaking, decision-making, responsibility, and teamwork.

Golden Ties / Prefects

- Responsibilities: Maintain school standards and rules, act as role models for younger pupils, support school events and other pupil leaders.
- Skills Developed: Leadership, communication, problem-solving, and event coordination.

Sports Leaders

- Responsibilities: Lead warm-ups, explain game rules, ensure safety, encourage teamwork and inclusion, support after-school clubs and sports events.
- Skills Developed: Physical fitness, teamwork, leadership, and event management.

Play Leaders

- Responsibilities: Lead games and activities during playtimes, manage groups of children, promote inclusion and teamwork.
- Skills Developed: Creativity, communication, conflict resolution, and leadership.

Digital Leaders

- Responsibilities: Assist with technology and digital tools, manage digital projects, promote safe and responsible use of devices, support collaborative digital projects.
- Skills Developed: Digital literacy, problem-solving, teamwork, and communication.

Health and Safety Leaders

- Responsibilities: Identify potential hazards, follow health and safety protocols, raise awareness, maintain a safe environment, organize safety routines and drills.
- Skills Developed: Responsibility, awareness, leadership, and communication.

Librarians / Literacy Leaders

- Responsibilities: Read aloud to peers or younger children, promote books and reading, manage library resources, lead book clubs or reading events, support younger pupils in choosing books.
- Skills Developed: Literacy, communication, organization, and leadership.

Gate Greeters

- Responsibilities: Help younger pupils arrive safely, model polite behaviour, create a welcoming environment, support transitions between home and school.
- Skills Developed: Communication, responsibility, empathy, and leadership.

Office Helpers

- Responsibilities: Organize administrative tasks, develop responsibility and attention to detail, communicate clearly with staff and pupils, support staff and peers in school operations.
- Skills Developed: Organization, communication, responsibility, and teamwork.
